DEVOTIONAL & HOME GROUP STUDY

Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal His truth and wisdom as you go through this lesson.

1. Read Genesis 1:1-2. In what sense do you need to go back to the truth that you're not the main character of your story—God is? How have you been living as if the main character is you?

"God's eternality is His aseity with respect to time and therefore His lordship over time. Because He is the creator of time, He stands above it, but enters it freely to do His will. He transcends time in that (1) He has no beginning or end; (2) He does not change; (3) He is equally conscious of past, present and future; and (4) He is not limited by the passing of time in what He can accomplish."

"The Bible does not try to prove God's existence or His eternality, but simply begins with the statement 'In the beginning, God' (Gen 1:1), indicating that at the beginning of recorded time, God was already in existence. From duration stretching backward without limit to duration stretching forward without limit, from eternal ages to eternal ages, God was and is forever."

- 2. Read Isaiah 40:21-31. The prophet Isaiah makes statements here about God, but the reader also senses that God is speaking about Himself in the first person. Why do you think God challenges people to compare Him to anyone or anything else (vv. 23-26)?
- 3. Have you experienced problems in the past year that you feared God was not big enough to handle or might not care about? How has this sermon given you a new way of approaching similar circumstances in the coming year?
- 4. Consider areas of your life in which you feel weary and powerless. How does meditating on the truths of these Scriptures encourage you?
- 5. After looking at some of His attributes, in what areas of your life do you especially need to surrender to the God who knows and understands more than you do?
- 6. This new year will bring many new beginnings we can't yet see. How will you endeavor to train your mind to begin with God, instead of the ways you've approached beginnings in the past?

- 3. Understand that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and that He rose again. (Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)
- 4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior. (Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9) "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16 NASB) You can use this prayer to express your decision to God:
- "Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen."
