#### **DEVOTIONAL & HOME GROUP STUDY**

Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal His truth and wisdom as you go through this lesson.

1. Read Genesis chapter 6, then read the following Scripture passages. In what ways is the world around you similar to the world in Noah's day? How might it be different?

Romans 1:18-32 a world that refuses God

Matthew 24:37-39 a world not at all concerned about judgment

2 Timothy 3:1-4 the state of the world before Jesus returns

2. Read 2 Corinthians 7:10. Describe the difference between worldly sorrow and godly sorrow. Does hearing about God's sorrow over sin help you articulate this difference more clearly?

- 3. Read Hebrews 11:7 and 2 Peter 2:5. Why did Noah find grace in God's eyes? How was he different from the world around him?
- 4. Noah wasn't sinless, but his contemporaries could find no fault with his actions, even as they hated him for his message of repentance. Read Philippians 1:9-11 and 2:12-15, and give examples of how Christians today are able to act righteously and blamelessly.
- 5. How did God's action of blotting out everything on the earth actually demonstrate His grace and mercy for the welfare of the human race, not just His judgment?

6. If you've accepted God's payment to blot out your sin, what disciplines do you have in your life that help you walk with God? What stumbling blocks that interfere do you need to remove?

#### - A WONDERFUL OFFER -

Being a Christian isn't based on membership in a local church or keeping a set of rules. It involves a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and an understanding of who He is and what He has done to provide man with a way to experience God's love for us. Here's how to know Jesus Christ as your personal Savior:

- 1. Realize that you are sinful and separated from God. (Romans 3:23; Isaiah 53:6)
- 2. Recognize that the penalty for your sin is death—eternal separation from God and all that is good. (Romans 6:23; Hebrews 9:27)
- 3. Understand that Jesus Christ took the penalty for your sin by dying in your place and that He rose again. (Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21)
- 4. Receive the free gift of salvation by trusting in Christ alone as your Savior. (Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9) "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16 NASB) You can use this prayer to express your decision to God:

"Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen.'
