ROMANS 1:18-32

EVERYONE HAS THE OPPORTUNITY TO KNOW

For what can be known about God is plain to them, because God has shown it to them. For his invisible attributes, namely, his eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made ... vv. 19-20

WHERE IT GOES BAD FOR MANKIND ...

faith in God and foolishly pursuing worldly wisdom

For the wrath of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men ... For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened. Claiming to be wise, they became fools ... vv. 18a, 21-22

what is true and right for a counterfeit

... and exchanged the glory of the immortal God for images resembling mortal man and birds and animals and creeping things. Therefore God gave them up in the lusts of their hearts to impurity, to the dishonoring of their bodies among themselves ... vv. 23-24

from God by submitting to the temporary over the eternal

... because they exchanged the truth about God for a lie and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever! Amen. v. 25

WHAT THE EFFECTS ARE ...

Dishonorable

For this reason God gave them up to dishonorable passions. For their women exchanged natural relations for those that are contrary to nature; and the men likewise gave up natural relations with women and were consumed with passion for one another, men committing shameless acts with men and receiving in themselves the due penalty for their error. And since they did not see fit to acknowledge God, God gave them up to a debased mind to do what ought not to be done. vv. 26-28

They were filled with all manner of unrighteousness, evil, covetousness, malice. They are full of envy, murder, strife, deceit, maliciousness. They are gossips, slanderers, haters of God, insolent, haughty, boastful, inventors of evil, disobedient to parents, foolish, faithless, heartless, ruthless. vv. 29-31

Though they know God's righteous decree that those who practice such things deserve to die, they not only do them but give approval to those who practice them. v. 32



BUT

But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ-by grace you have been saved ... Ephesians 2:4-5

HOW DOES SOMEONE WHO IS LOST IN SIN FIND FREEDOM?

- Acknowledge God and His ways as true and right.
- Focus on your heavenly Father running toward you.
- Receive His grace and forgiveness as you move toward Him.
- Stay home.

HOW DOES A CHRISTIAN LOVE SOMEONE WELL WHO IS LOST IN SIN?

- 1 See their sin rightly.
- Approach them with compassion, in full awareness of your own sin and need of grace.
- (3) Care enough to share and model what is true.
- 3 Sit on the porch.

ROAD TO REDEMPTION

DEVOTIONAL STUDY

Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal His truth and wisdom as you go through this lesson.

- 1. Read Romans 1:18-32. Why do people not want to admit their quilt? How have you experienced this yourself?
- 2. In verse 20, what aspects of God noted here provide evidence of His existence? Give examples of what each looks like.
- 3. People crave meaning, so when they reject God they worship other "idols" in His place (v. 23). What people, places or things are celebrated as idols?
- 4. How are our attitudes toward identity and sexuality affected when we deny God? What occurs as a result?
- 5. When we examine the list of sins worthy of death in verses 29-31, what do we realize about our own sin as a fellow member of the human race? Why is this important to understand?
- 6. In what ways do you struggle to reconcile God's wrath toward sin with His love for us?

If you know someone who has rejected God and is lost in sin, how can you "sit on the porch" and intercede for them this week?

"The moment we embark on a study of the Roman epistle we are confronted with the statement that the wrath of God is part of the righteousness of God-a concept so unnerving to many and distasteful to others that innumerable attempts have been made to avoid the subject. Even a cursory glance at Paul's argument, however, will show that any attempt to avoid what he had to say about the wrath of God at the beginning of his presentation of the gospel would be disastrous. The answer to the problem of the 'wrath of God' is to be found in understanding it, not avoiding it. ... But divine wrath should never be confused with human anger for it contains none of the uncontrolled passion, the unreasonable outbursts, the selfvindication that are the unfortunate ingredients of human wrath. God's wrath is 'right': it is a holy response to the unholy, a just reaction to the unjust, a pure rejection of the impure. In fact, for God not to express wrath at much of what goes on in our world would be wrong. Not only is His wrath intrinsically rightfailure to respond in wrath would be intrinsically wrong."

(Romans 4:4-5; Ephesians 2:8-9) "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16 NASB) You can use this prayer to express your decision to God: "Dear God, I know that I am a sinner. I believe that Jesus Christ died on the cross for me and rose from the dead. I trust in Him alone as the only way to get right with You. Thank You for the forgiveness of sins and the eternal life I now have. Amen."
