## LAMENTATIONS SUMMARIZED IN A WORD OR PHRASE: "Funeral Dirge"

#### **FUNERAL DIRGE**

Your song would have served as a reminder

Zechariah 7:1-7; never forget what happened

It would have served as a warning

Never let this happen again!

And ... it would have served as a source of comfort

We're knocked down, but we're not knocked out

God's mercies are new every morning for the humble, brokenhearted and repentant

## THE BASICS ...

Who: an unknown eyewitness (Jeremiah) When: around 586 BC (between 586-583/582)

Where: probably to the exiled remnant in Babylon and/or Egypt

Why: Lamentations is "... is a funeral dirge over an irrecoverable past." –H. L. Ellison

**LESSON THEME:** How God turned the resistant into the repentant

## **Five Songs or Funeral Dirges**

The desolation and misery of Jerusalem (1)

The Lord's anger with His people (2)

The author's complaint and hope (3)

Judah's past and present (4)

A final appeal to the Lord (5)

#### **Summary of Lamentations**

A minority of Judah had been responsive

They knew what God had said about their sins

They took it to heart

They repented ... or they remained faithful

Most of the people, however, were resistant

They knew what God had said about their sins

They ignored, denied or put it behind their backs

They needed God's loving discipline (Deut 28)

Through discipline, the resistant repented

They learned again about the wages of sin: it brings tragedy, sorrow, separation, pain and loss

Became soft and humble of heart

Agreed with God's perspective and repented

Turned to Him with a renewed responsiveness of faith, trust and obedience

Began "new lives" with Him as their old lives were absolutely irrecoverable now

And so Lamentations served as a reminder

Never forget what happened

Lamentations served as a warning

Never let this happen again!

Lamentations served as a source of comfort

## **APPLICATION:** Turning the resistant into the repentant

#### Some of Us Have Been Turned

Some of us were once resistant ... but were turned through corrective Divine discipline

That discipline we brought on ourselves may have even spilled over onto others

We've experienced the grief that comes from such a tragedy, and the pain that comes from having to acknowledge our sin and itsconsequences

We've written our own book of lamentations

#### Some of Us Are Yet to Be Turned

Others of us are running the risk of ...

Self-righteously overestimating our own responsiveness to the Lord and His Word

Pridefully underestimating our resistance to the changes He wishes to make in our lives

Which road are you walking down?

Will it take the Lord's discipline for you to follow Him more fully?

# Are You Responsive or Resistant?

The responsive ...

Know what God has said first-hand from the Word

Believe it and internalize it

Progressively, intentionally and graciously align their daily thoughts, decisions and actions to it

Dependently ask the Holy Spirit of God to empower them to walk in His ways—daily

See evidences of life change and increased joy

Have their hearts broken over what breaks His

The resistant ...

Know what God has said, but only second-hand

Believe it ... but rationalize, justify and excuse the slowness of their internalization

Pray irregularly except for times of personal stress or crisis ... or during another's stress or crisis

Have a "when/then" attitude toward change

Seldom see evidences of life change; joyless

Have their hearts broken over petty things

► Are you responsive or resistant?

## Hope for the Partly Resistant

We need to get into God's Word

Know what He's said for yourself first-hand

Nourishment only comes through digestion

We need to get on our knees

Have a humble and teachable spirit of a servant

Ask for sensitivity and responsiveness to Him

Meet regularly with others who will encourage us ... and keep us accountable


# Parallels Between Lamentations and Deuteronomy

#### Lamentations

- 1:3 She dwells among the nations; she finds no resting place.
- 1:5 Her foes have become her masters.
- 1:5 Her children have gone into exile, captive before the foe.
- 1:6 In weakness they have fled before the pursuer.
- 1:18 My young men and maidens have gone into exile.
- 2:15 All who pass your way clap their hands at you; they scoff and shake their heads at the Daughter of Jerusalem.
- 2:20 Should women eat their offspring, the children they have cared for?
- 2:21 Young and old lie together in the dust of the streets.
- 4:10 With their own hands compassionate women have cooked their own children.
- 5:2 Our inheritance has been turned over to aliens, our homes to foreigners.
- 5:5 We are weary and find no rest.
- 5:10 Our skin is hot as an oven, feverish from hunger.
- 5:11 Women have been ravished in Zion, and virgins in the towns of Judah.
- 5:12 Elders are shown no respect.
- 5:18 Mount Zion . . . lies desolate, with jackals prowling over it.

# Deuteronomy

- 28:65 Among those nations you will find no repose, no resting place for the sole of your foot.
- 28:44 He will be the head, but you will be the tail.
- 28:32 Your sons and daughters will be given to another nation.
- 28:25 The LORD will cause you to be defeated before your enemies. You will come at them from one direction but flee from them in seven.
- 28:41 You will have sons and daughters but you will not keep them, because they will go into captivity.
- 28:37 You will become a thing of horror and an object of scorn and ridicule to all the nations where the LORD will drive you.
- 28:53 Because of the suffering that your enemy will inflict on you during the siege, you will eat the fruit of the womb, the flesh of the sons and daughters the LORD your God has given you.
- 28:50 ... a fierce-looking nation without respect for the old or pity for the young.
- 28:56- The most gentle and sensitive woman among you . . . will begrudge the husband she loves and her own son or daughter the afterbirth from her womb and the children she bears. For she intends to eat them secretly during the siege.
- 28:30 You will build a house, but you will not live in it.
- 28:65 Among those nations you will find no repose.
- 28:48 In hunger and thirst . . . you will serve the enemies the LORD sends against you.
- 28:30 You will be pledged to be married to a woman, but another will take her and ravish her.
- 28:50 . . . a fierce-looking nation without respect for the old . . .
- 28:26 Your carcasses will be food for all the birds of the air and the beasts of the earth, and there will be no one to frighten them away.
