THE TIMES

It's 586 BC

Babylon has been summoned by the Lord to discipline Judah for her sin

The people of Judah are being executed and/or deported

And Edom ...

THE BASICS ...

Who: Obadiah When: around 586 BC

Where: probably to the exiled remnant in Babylon and/or Egypt

Why: "This small book speaks of the danger of the great sin of pride and arrogance, the feeling of superiority that often results from taking advantage of others." –Walt Baker

LESSON THEME: Pride destroys from the inside out

The Surprise (v. 1)

From one of Edom's "allies" some unnamed ambassador is even now rounding up the nations to fight against him

This ambassador, however, was just an unwitting servant sent by the Lord

Those Edom thought were her "allies" were even now secretly banding together to betray and overthrow her!

The Verdict (vv. 2-9)

Your heart is proud (vv. 2-3)

Is exalted, proud, arrogant and self-secure

I am going to bring you down (vv. 4-9)

You are not beyond My reach

You will be thoroughly plundered

You will lose your homeland to an "inside job"

Everything you take pride in (your wisdom, strength and security) will be taken from you

Your violence and indifference toward your brother in his time of need (vv. 10-11)

APPLICATION: Pride destroys from the inside out

Pride's Spirit

Like Esau's spirit ...

Had no use for the promises of God

Made decisions "from his stomach" (based on his fleshly appetites, e.g. the red stew)

Lived independently of God (not in His Word, prayer or worship)

Like Edom's spirit ...

The profane and the godless were her allies

Eventually her "allies" deceived and betrayed her

Edom thought more highly of herself than she should have

"... not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think ..." (Rom 12:3, ESV)

Edom was wise in her own eyes

"Never be wise in your own sight." (Rom 12:16ff)

Edom felt secure because of her situation and resources

Pride's End

God stands opposed to the proud

"God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble." (James 4:6, ESV)

God disciplines the proud

"Pride goes before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall." (Prov 16:18, ESV)

Pride's "Inside Job" On Us

Pride promotes a self-reliant spirit

Pride promotes a self-determining spirit

Pride promotes a self-secure spirit

Pride is the traitor within the gates of our city

3 attitudes we nurture/invite into our lives ...

By how we spend our time

By what we watch or listen to ("you deserve it!")

By who we hang out with ("Worldly Wiseman")

Will one day turn on us like a "pet" lion

Under their influence we can quickly and easily become deceived ... and they WILL betray us from the inside out

Humble ourselves before God


"So humble yourselves under the mighty power of God, and at the right time he will lift you up in honor." (1 Pet 5:6) Pursue Jesus' lifestyle of service

"Don't be selfish; don't try to impress others. Be humble, thinking of others as better than yourselves ..." (Phil 2:3-11)

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

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Key Places in Obadiah, about 586 Bc. The Babylonians destroyed Jerusalem in 586 Bc and took most of the people of Judah into exile. The surrounding peoples helped the Babylonians and rejoiced over Judah's destruction. None helped or rejoiced more than the people of Edom, so Obadiah announced their judgment by God. • Edom was noted for its rocky strongholds (v 3), its pride and self-sufficiency (vv 2-4), and its wisdom tradition (v 8).
