Simple Questions to Invite, Encourage, and REACH Others

We know that being, making, and reaching can happen in our everyday lives — and Christmas is no different! This season, we can REACH by starting conversations that lead to deeper, spiritual topics. We hope this resource helps you spark those conversations and connect with others in meaningful ways. Try these 10 Christmas conversation starters as a way to engage others in spiritual conversations:

1. "What's your favorite Christmas tradition — and why do you think it means so much to you?"

This opens the door to talk about what matters most and can naturally lead into the meaning of Christmas.

2. "What's something the holidays make you grateful for — or long for?"

This helps uncover values, hopes, and even heart posture.

3. "Who or what helps you stay grounded during the holiday chaos?"

This reveals their source of stability and gives you space to share about the peace you've found in Christ.

4. "What do you think the world needs most this Christmas?"

This easily leads into conversations about hope, redemption, and God's goodness.

5. "Have you ever had a Christmas that changed your life in some way?"

This invites personal stories and opens the door to talk about spiritual transformation.

6. "Do you have any thoughts about the nativity story? Ever found it interesting, strange, or meaningful?"

This welcomes honest questions and creates a path toward the gospel.

7. "If you could give one non-material gift to everyone this year, what would it be?"

This helps reveal what they value most and what they believe people truly need.

8. "What do you think gives the holiday season its sense of wonder?"

This lets you explore what captures their awe — and can lead to the wonder of Jesus' birth.

9. "Do the holidays ever make you think about big-picture things?"

This creates space for deeper reflections and spiritual curiosity.

10. "What's one Christmas memory that shaped you in some way?"

This opens the door to meaningful stories about family, identity, and faith.

As you take time to connect with someone this season, you're offering more than your words — you're opening the door for them to hear the gospel and meet the one true God. We're praying for our whole Christ Chapel family as we continue to REACH this season.
